



The [Airports Authority of India](#) (AAI) has begun a development programme that would cost over 25,000 crores over the next five years in order to resurrect the country's aviation sector, which has been severely impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic.

The amount of 25,000 crore will be used for the expansion and modification of existing terminals, new terminals, the expansion or strengthening of existing runways, aprons, [Airport Navigation Services](#) (ANS), control towers, technical blocks, and other projects, according to the Civil Aviation Ministry. In addition, three Public-Private Partnership (PPP) airports in Delhi, Hyderabad, and Bengaluru have announced massive development plans worth 30,000 crores by 2025 as part of their revitalization efforts.
