



A number of distinguished dignitaries, including Sunil Sethi, head of the Fashion Design Council of India, and Upendra Prasad Singh, secretary of the Indian government's ministry of textiles, took part in the grand inaugural ceremony of [Gartex Texprocess](#) in New Delhi. We are also focusing on incentivising textile machine manufacturing to encourage foreign manufacturers to build textile machinery within India."

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
